ACHF Annual Grant Report

1. The name of the project and a project description:

Name: 2023 Veteran's Memorial

<u>Project Description</u>: In April 2022, a Veterans Memorial Task Force was formally established to identify a location and recommend a final design for a new and improved veterans memorial. The existing Veterans Memorial is located in American Legion Park and was originally established in 1989 as a monument for local servicemen and women who died in major conflicts dating back to the Dakota War.



The Veterans Memorial Task Force was created with the goal of relocating the existing memorial monument to a more accessible location and expanding the memorial to honor all those who have served and were honorably discharged. The task force made up of VFW and American Legion members developed a final plan identifying the new memorial location within the same American Legion Park and including numerous improvements including large upright engraved honor panels, new lighting, new electric plug-ins for hosting events, colored decorative sidewalk, new seating, decorative plantings, new sidewalk for ADA accessibility, and reinstallation of the existing rehabilitated memorial monuments.

- 4. The amount and source of any additional funding or leverage:
 - Funding for the project came from the Arts and Cultural Heritage Fund (\$12,500) and the donation of funds from the public and businesses. Total Funding to Date: \$32,727.
- 5. The duration of the project(s):
 - The project began with the establishment of the Task Force in April 2022. The final location and concept for the new Veterans Memorial was approved by the City Council in September 2022. The development of final plans and specs started in spring of 2023 and was completed in early 2024. The project is currently in the fundraising phase to allow for the completion of the actual construction.
- 6. The number of full-time equivalents funded under the project(s). For the purposes of this item, "full-time equivalent" means a position directly attributed to the receipt of money from one or more of the funds covered under this section, calculated as the total number of hours planned for the position divided by 2,088.
 - The City hired a professional consulting engineering and surveying firm to assist with the development of the final concept along with the final design and specs. A total of 409 hours of consultant time was spent on this project for a total FTE of



0.20. Additional hours were spent by city staff supporting the Veterans Memorial Task Force and participating in meetings.

- 7. The direct expenses and administration costs of the project(s):
 - Expenses to date total \$46,493.00.
- 8. Proposed measurable outcomes and the plan for measuring and evaluating the results:

The following outcomes were established for this project:

- <u>Outcome</u>: There will be an increase in the number of Minnesotans of all ages, ethnicities, abilities, and incomes who will be able to participate in the arts, culture and history.
 - <u>Evaluation Method</u>: An annual event will be held at the memorial to honor all current veterans and those that are honored in the Memorial. We will be able to do individual counts of attendees.
- <u>Outcome</u>: Increased knowledge and awareness of the way that history affects people's lives and how that knowledge can help people make informed decisions for the future.
 - <u>Evaluation Method</u>: We will be asking the school to include the memorial in part of its history curriculum as it has listed veterans who died in past wars engraved on stones in the Memorial.

- 10. Actual measured outcomes and evaluation of projects as required under 129D.17, subdivision 2:

The Veterans Memorial Task Force identified three (3) things they wanted to ensure the design of the new memorial included:

i. They wanted to honor the current memorial. This goal was accomplished by the relocation and reinstallation of the existing memorial monument as the main centerpiece of the new memorial. The new memorial is circular in design with the existing memorial monument located directly in the center. Additional rehabilitation and engraving are proposed to eliminate the appearance of the front and back of the current monument achieving equality for all the names honored.



- ii. They wanted to have a place to honor all who served regardless of whether they were passed or still living. This goal was accomplished by incorporating four (4) new double-sided granite panels allowing for the engraving of any service member who honorably served in any branch of the military. The proposed memorial design identifies the location for two (2) additional future panels with additional space for up to eight (8) total.
- iii. They wanted to honor our military services. This goal was accomplished by the proposed installation of flag poles dedicated to each branch of the service. Further, recognition is proposed with concrete bands sandblasted with the name of each branch of service in line with the respective flag pole.
- 11. Education about the areas and issues the projects address, including, when feasible, maps of where projects have been undertaken:
 - The new Veterans Memorial is proposed to remain within the City's American Legion Park located less than 400 feet away from the existing location. American Legion Park is the main park that sits in the central portion of the City and is the site for many special events, including the main city-wide summer celebration Giant Days. The location for the new Veterans Memorial will provide visibility from the nearby roadway, which also serves as the main Giant Days parade route, as well as provide ADA pedestrian accessibility from the adjacent concrete trail. The existing memorial is used for Veteran's Day but lacks the accessibility, space, and electrical infrastructure necessary to host a truly honorable event.
 - The new Veteran's Memorial will provide a memorial that honors all service members, both those honorably discharged and those who gave the ultimate sacrifice, which will allow for an increase in the appreciation, interest, and understanding of the history of military service in the local Le Sueur area.

- 12. All frameworks developed for future uses of each fund:
 - The Veterans Memorial Task Force and City understand that expenditure of future funds will be required to facilitate the construction and future maintenance of the new memorial. The Task Force is continuing to identify fundraising opportunities in order to develop the funds necessary to proceed with construction. Upon completion of the final memorial the City will develop a maintenance work plan and funding will be recognized as needed.
- 13. Methods by which members of the public may apply for project funds under any of the constitutionally dedicated funds:
 - All grant funds received with this grant were expected as part of the project that has been delivered and are no longer available.
